Who are we?


Performers Theatre Company is a successful performing arts school located in Hampshire, UK. Our school prides itself on providing exceptional performing arts classes that allow all young people to express themselves and gain the skills needed to succeed both in their personal and professional lives.

Our school's vision of 'Be Your Best' embodies all that we do, allowing our young people to not only reach their potential but challenge themselves in the process.

Performers Theatre Company provides a warm and supportive environment yet ensures children take full responsibility for their achievements and successes. Our community is at the heart of everything that we do and without it, we would not run effectively or successfully.

Performers was first coined back in 2011 by its Principal, Sam Gibbs, when he was 17 however it was never fully established until December 2021. The school's grand opening took place in May 2022 following a launch party in April that same year.

Sam had always dreamt of opening a performing arts theatre school for a number of years as he wanted to put his acting, musical theatre and directorial talents to good use. He generated a number of names including High Five Theatre before settling with Performers Theatre Company as he believed the name represented the diversity and scope of the performance industry.

Respect

Respect during classes is always expected. Children are to respect each other and the adults that are there to ensure classes run correctly and safely. Children are to ensure they listen, are courteous, kind, and helpful to all around them. There is a zero tolerance of bullying and unkind behaviour will be dealt with at the highest severity.

Remember: Performers is not a state school. If you are not behaving appropriately, you will be given a formal written warning by the Principal in the first instance and in the second instance unenrolment.

Attendance

Once enrolled in a Performers' class, children are expected to attend every class. If more than three consecutive weeks have elapsed without notifying us, it will be assumed that the child has left Performers and will be removed from enrolment. Formal notification of absence must not be made through another pupil or parent.

If a child is unable to attend a class, Performers must be informed as soon as possible via email, text or phone. If arrangements have been made which results in a child not being able to attend, the Principal must be informed at least four weeks in advance.

Punctuality

Children must arrive to classes on time. Parents/carers must inform the school if they are going to be running late. Arriving late impacts on the class, teacher and students.

Drop Off/Collection

Parents/carers are asked to drop off their children directly before the start of their class and collect immediately at the end of class. If you have made arrangements to take another child home, this must be cleared with Performers.

Electronics

Mobile phones, laptops or devices that may distract children should not be used. If any electronic is brought in, it must be placed in a coat/bag and not used throughout the duration of the class. If seen, the electronic will be confiscated until the end of the lesson and the parent/carer informed.

Children should make sure that they keep their valuables and personal items with them at all times. Performers regrets that we cannot be held responsible if items go missing.

Feedback/Complaints

As a school, we are always learning and wanting to grow. Our staff do everything in the best interests of the children but at times, things do not always go to plan or as expected. We appreciate positive and constructive feedback from our parents/carers and our students. If you have any feedback, you can always speak to us in person or via email/phone.

If you have a concern or complaint, this must be done in person wherever possible. Under no circumstances, should concerns be raised in front of the children. Failure to have professional conversations with our staff will result in you being asked to leave the premises.

Uniform

Performers Theatre Company takes great pride in every aspect of what we doincluding the presentation of our school and its students. For this reason, we maintain a clear and consistent uniform policy. Our uniform not only ensures that all students present a smart and professional image that reflects the values of Performers, but it also serves as an important health and safety measure, supporting the safeguarding and wellbeing of our young people.

As Performers Theatre Company operates within hired public venues, it is essential that our students are easily identifiable at all times. For this reason, we ask that all children attend classes wearing the official Performers uniform. Students who are not in uniform may be unable to participate, as this presents a safeguarding concern.

What are the expectations for uniform?

All students are required to wear a Performers polo shirt or T-shirt. All other items of uniform must be navy blue or black in colour. Additional Performers-branded uniform is optional but may be worn if preferred.

Footwear must consist of jazz shoes, trainers, or bare feet, and plain black leotards are also an acceptable form of uniform. For health and safety reasons, hair must be tied back for all classes, and no jewellery is permitted other than a watch or small stud earrings. False nails are not allowed. Hair accessories may be worn if used to tie hair back and should be navy blue or black to match the uniform.

Students attending a free trial must also wear navy blue or black clothing, and the same expectations apply. Please note that uniform requirements differ for our School of Dance - full details can be found on our website.

Uniform items can be purchased at our reception desk, subject to availability. All other items should be ordered directly from The Uniform Company, our official uniform supplier.

Fees

At Performers Theatre Company, we are proud to offer high-quality performing arts training at affordable prices. We recognise the challenges that many families face due to the lasting impact of the pandemic and the current cost of living, and we believe that every child should have the opportunity to thrive in the performing arts without financial barriers.

Our **current monthly fees** can be found on our website:

www.performerstheatrecompany.com/fees.

These cover our weekday and weekend classes and do not include additional costs for extra rehearsals, masterclasses or summer schools.

Payments are made **monthly in advance** through our secure provider, **ClassManager**, which offers a range of convenient payment options. Fees are calculated by taking the individual session cost, multiplying by **39** sessions per academic year, and dividing into **12 equal monthly payments**.

We also provide a **no-obligation free trial**, allowing students to experience our classes before committing.

To support families, we offer a **15% sibling** discount for a second child and **10% for each** additional sibling thereafter.

(For example, if a Musical Theatre class costs £26.20 per month, the second child's payment would be £22.27, making a total of £48.47 for two siblings.)

Student Leadership and Pupil Mentorship



Nurturing leaders

At Performers Theatre Company, we take pride in nurturing young people for success, both in the performing arts and beyond. Our classes focus not only on developing performance skills but also on building confidence, teamwork, independence, resilience, and social skills. We aim to empower students to become leaders, encouraging them to take responsibility within the school and contribute positively in classes, rehearsals, and the wider community.

Each year, our **Head Boy** and **Head Girl** are appointed through an application process and a performance speech delivered to the students. They play an active role in shaping the school, offering ideas and solutions, and supporting their peers. Head students are easily identifiable by their personalised uniform and badge, and their appointments are **celebrated at our annual Awards Ceremony in July**.

In addition, our **Pupil Mentorship Scheme** pairs senior students with a 'StageBuddy' from the Infant or Junior Musical Theatre classes. **Twice per term**, mentors guide their StageBuddy under teacher supervision, acting as role models, supporting their development, and inspiring the younger students. This initiative fosters leadership, responsibility, and a sense of community across all ages at

Our core classes take place on Friday evenings in Waterlooville and on Saturdays in Havant. Classes range from Musical Theatre, Acting and Singing. We also offer adult classes.

Throughout the year, we hold regular masterclasses and workshops with industry professionals and hold open auditions for our yearly productions that are of a high quality for all to enjoy.



School of Dance

The Performers School of Dance reflects everything that makes Performers Theatre Company exceptional, with a streamlined focus on dance technique.

Our classes cover a wide range of styles, including modern, tap, jazz and ballet, and offer the opportunity to work towards ISTD examinations for those who wish to do so. Examinations are entirely optional, and students may participate in classes purely for the enjoyment and development of their skills. Decisions regarding exam entry are made by our Head of School to ensure the best outcomes for each child.

We are incredibly excited about this new venture and look forward to inspiring students to grow, develop, and enjoy dance at every level.



Adult Classes

Since January 2024, we have offered adult classes for those aged 18 and over. The sessions are enjoyable and stress-free with the aim of giving adults a chance to enhance their talents or simply to let loose and have a great time away from their usual way of life.

Holiday Schools

In addition to our core classes, regular masterclasses, and annual productions, Performers Theatre Company offers a variety of holiday schools and excursions.

Our annual 5-day summer school is a highlight of the year, where students work towards a final performance, often based on a well-known musical. Throughout the week, children focus on the three key disciplines while also developing skills in audition technique, stage presence, stage makeup, prop design, and much more, creating a fully immersive and inspiring experience.



Excursions

Performers Theatre Company offers regular West End excursions, providing students with unforgettable experiences in the heart of London's theatre scene. Our trips have included Musical Theatre masterclasses at renowned institutions and visits to iconic productions such as *Wicked, The Lion King*, and *Oliver*.

These excursions give students a chance to learn from industry professionals, experience world-class performances, and enjoy inspiring days out that enhance their love of the performing arts. Daily excursions and overnight residential trips are set to become a staple part of the Performers experience each year.




With limited spaces to ensure individual attention, participants have the opportunity to refine their skills,

Talent Agency

Performers Theatre Company formed an official partnership with **Dub Juniors & Dub International Talent Agency**, a highly respected organisation dedicated to developing young talent within the performing arts and screen industries, in October 2025. This collaboration provides our students with the opportunity to work alongside leading professionals and gain valuable insight and experience within film, television, and theatre.



Dub Juniors additionally operates a thriving **Supporting Artist (SA) division**, offering young people the chance to experience life on a professional set and gain confidence as background artists across productions for Netflix, Disney+, the BBC, and more.

Matthew Bearne, who has worked closely with Performers for several years, plays a key role in supporting this partnership. His expertise, passion and industry knowledge is invaluable in guiding our young performers as they take advantage of a range of exciting opportunities.

Productions

At Performers Theatre Company, students are regularly given the chance to perform on stage, from showcases to full-scale musical productions.

Our productions begin with an open audition process, followed by 7-9 months of rehearsals. This immersive experience allows cast members to gain a true understanding of the demands and rewards of producing a high-quality musical performance, while developing confidence, teamwork, and performance skills that last a lifetime.

Performers Theatre Company offers a range of performance opportunities throughout the year. Our JR production begins with Open Auditions in August or September, followed by a 7–9 month rehearsal period, with performances typically held during the Easter holidays or May/June half term in a professional theatre.

Our **full-scale musical**, featuring both adults and children, takes place during the **October half term**, with auditions held in **May/June**.

In addition, students can participate in other productions, including **Christmas pantomimes** and **Teen productions**, with auditions scheduled at various times throughout the year. Regular **showcases** and **'End of Term Drop-In' sessions** give students further opportunities to share their progress, build confidence, and develop performance skills across a range of disciplines.





Participation in a Performers Theatre Company production does incur a fee. Our affordable fees can be paid either as a one-off payment or spread monthly for convenience.

Fees cover all aspects of producing a highquality performance, including staff wages, rehearsal room hire, theatre hire, costumes, sets, and props. We are committed to ensuring that all productions are delivered to a professional standard, giving students an authentic, enriching theatre experience. Being part of a Performers Theatre Company production is an exciting but **intense process**, requiring a high level of commitment from both the student and their parent/carer.

All participants are required to **read and acknowledge our Production Code of Conduct** before accepting a role. This ensures everyone is aware of expectations and helps maintain a **professional**, **safe**, **and supportive environment** throughout the production process.

We regularly receive opportunities to market our events including performances at different public venues such as shopping centres as well as filming promo trailers and attending radio station interviews.


