SYNOPSIS

Based on the hit film, this hilarious new musical follows Dewey Finn, a failed, wannabe rock star who decides to earn a few extra bucks by posing as a substitute teacher at a prestigious prep school. There he turns a class of straight-A students into a guitar-shredding, bass-slapping, mind-blowing rock band. While teaching these pint-sized prodigies what it means to truly rock, Dewey falls for the school's beautiful, but uptight headmistress, helping her rediscover the wild child within.

REHEARSALS

A rehearsal schedule is available on the website prior to Open Auditions. This is subject to change.

Rehearsals will take place from Wednesday 3rd June 2026. Rehearsals will take place **once a week at Park Community School on a Wednesday evening between 6pm and 8pm.** Times may vary throughout the rehearsal process. Rehearsals will become more frequent as the show dates draw closer.

There will be a **week long rehearsal block from Monday 17th August to Friday 21st August 2026.** These rehearsals will take place from 10am-4pm. All cast will be required for these dates.

Show week will commence from Monday 26th October with rehearsals taking place every day (times will vary). A tech rehearsal will take place on Tuesday 27th October and a dress rehearsal on Wednesday 28th October. All cast will be required for show week.

Rehearsals are for learning vocals, choreography, lines and blocking scenes. They are essential for the production's creation and commitment to both rehearsal period and performances are vital.

FEES

There are no fees to audition.

Rehearsals will cost **£10 per session.** Half day rehearsals (17th - 21st August & 25th / 26th October) cost **£20 per session** and full day rehearsals (27th / 28th October) cost **£35 per session.**

There are three options to pay for rehearsal fees:

1. Pay fees upfront (£370) or;
2. Spread cost equally over 5 months (£74 per month – starting June)
3. Pay for rehearsals monthly (cost will vary depending on the number of rehearsals (i.e. June has 4 rehearsals so this would equate to £32)

Rehearsal fees cover the costs of room hire, staff wages and support towards production costs (e.g. set, costumes, props)

AUDITIONS

Auditions for this production are open to all - you do not have to be enrolled at Performers to take part.

Auditions will be held on Friday 15th May at Park Community School in Havant.

It is important that you have read this pack clearly in addition to our Production and Rehearsal Policy which can be found on the audition registration page. This outlines our expectations for all.

To book an audition:

Audition registration will be available to book via our website from Friday 17th April 2026 at 9am. This will close on Monday 11th May at 9am.

Audition process:

Children up to 18

All children up to 18 are to arrive ready for a 5pm start.

The first hour (5-6pm) will involve a 'dance workshop and audition'. Those auditioning will be given a short dance routine to learn in an intense dance workshop. Children will then be split into small groups where they will show the routine to the panel. Following this, all children will head back to the waiting area. Those auditioning for 'ensemble' will be free to leave.

In contrast to previous open auditions, where auditionees were given numbers, the audition order will be displayed throughout the waiting area on the day.

Those auditioning for roles where an instrument is required to be played (Zack, Katie, Freddy, Lawrence) will enter the audition room first, as per the audition order that will be displayed. Once these children have auditioned, they will be held in a break out room and re-enter the audition room as a group along with adults who are auditioning for Dewey Finn.

Once this has taken place, the individual auditions will commence. Children will wait in the waiting area and when their name is called, will enter to complete their audition.

18+

With the exception of **those auditioning for Dewey Finn, who are expected to arrive at 6pm, those aged 18 or over are to arrive at 8pm**. There will be no dance workshop and audition; individual auditions will commence once all children have auditioned.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will someone read on for other character's lines?

Yes, one of the audition panel will do this.

Can props be brought in?

If the auditionee feels it will benefit their audition, absolutely!

Will there be music provided?

Yes, auditionees do not need to bring bluetooth speakers etc.

Do I need to bring an instrument?

If you are auditioning for a role where you are required to play a musical instrument, you will be expected to bring this. If you are auditioning for Freddy, a drum kit will be provided.

Can I still audition for a role if I have no instrument experience?

Yes but this will need to be stated when registering.

Can more than one character be auditioned for?

Auditionees can audition for one character only. Auditionees can write down any other characters they are interested in through the registration form as we may feel they are suited to a different role.

How long will the audition last for?

The dance workshop will last 1 hour. The individual audition will take no more than 10 minutes; it will be slightly longer for those auditioning for a role where an instrument is required. How long it takes is also no indication as to whether the auditionee has been cast or not.

What do I do if I am auditioning for ensemble?

Those auditioning for ensemble will complete the dance workshop and are then free to leave.

What if I cannot attend the audition date?

Those unable to attend the audition date are to email their audition in (admin@performerstheatrecoumpany.com). The audition must include all audition material for chosen character. Those auditioning for ensemble must include a solo song (of their choice) and a monologue no longer than 1 minute.

Please ensure that registration is completed in the same way. Absence must be stated in the comments section of the form.

We must receive this by Friday 1st May 2026. After this, entries will not be considered.

Summary

Eligibility & Production

- Auditions are open to everyone; you do not need to be enrolled at Performers.
- Auditions take place on Friday 15th May at Park Community School, Havant
- All auditionees must read the audition pack and the Production & Rehearsal Policy before attending.

Booking an Audition

- Registration opens Friday 17th April 2026 at 9am and closes Monday 11th May at 9am.
- Auditions must be booked via the website.

Audition Process (Under 18s)

- All children arrive ready for a 5pm start.
- A dance workshop and audition (5-6pm) takes place first.
- Ensemble auditionees may leave after the dance workshop.
- Audition order will be displayed in the waiting area (no numbered system).
- Instrumental roles audition first, followed by individual auditions.

Audition Process (18+)

- Adults (18+) arrive at 8pm, except those auditioning for Dewey Finn, who arrive at 6pm.
- No dance workshop for adults; auditions begin after children finish.

Audition Requirements

- A panel member will read opposite auditionees.
- Props are allowed if helpful.
- Music is provided.
- Instruments must be brought for relevant roles (except drums for Freddy, which are provided).
- Only one character may be auditioned for, though others can be listed as interest.

If You Cannot Attend

- Auditions may be submitted by email with all required material.
- Deadline for emailed auditions is Friday 1st May 2026.
- Late submissions will not be considered.
