INTRODUCTION

Based on J.M. Barrie's classic tale and featuring an unforgettable score by Morris "Moose" Charlap and Jule Styne with lyrics by Carolyn Leigh and Betty Comden and Adolph Green, Peter Pan is one of the most beloved and frequently performed family favorites of all time. This high-flying Tony Award-winning musical has been performed around the world and delighted audiences for 60 years and is now being adapted by Performers Theatre Company in 2026.

SYNOPSIS

Peter and his mischievous fairy sidekick, Tinkerbell, visit the nursery of the Darling children late one night and, with a sprinkle of pixie dust, begin a magical journey across the stars that none of them will ever forget. In the adventure of a lifetime, the travelers come face to face with a ticking crocodile, a fierce Indian tribe, a band of bungling pirates and, of course, the villainous Captain Hook.

Featuring the iconic songs, "I'm Flying," "I've Gotta Crow," "I Won't Grow Up" and "Never Never Land," and a rousing book full of magic, warmth and adventure, Peter Pan JR. is the perfect show for the child in all of us... who dreamed of soaring high and never growing up. Peter Pan JR. is a dream come true for groups looking to bring magic to their stage and entertain countless families.

REHEARSALS

A rehearsal schedule is available on the website prior to Open Auditions. This is subject to change.

Rehearsals will take place from Wednesday 5th November 2025. Rehearsals will take place once a week at Park Community School on a Wednesday evening between 6pm and 8pm. Times may vary throughout the rehearsal process. Rehearsals will become more frequent as the show dates draw closer.

There will be three full day rehearsals during the Christmas holidays from Sunday 28th - Tuesday 30th December 2025. These rehearsals will take place from 10am-4pm. All cast will be required for these dates.

Show week will commence from Tuesday 7th April with rehearsals taking place every day (times will vary). A tech rehearsal will take place on Friday 10th April 2026 and a dress rehearsal on Saturday 11th April 2026. Both will take place at the New Theatre Royal in Portsmouth. <u>All cast will be required for show week</u>.

Rehearsals are for learning vocals, choreography, lines and blocking scenes. They are essential for the production's creation and commitment to both rehearsal period and performances are vital.

FFFS

There are no fees to audition.

Rehearsals will cost **£8 per session**. 6 hour rehearsal days (28th - 30th December) and show week rehearsals (7th - 10th April 2026) cost **£18 per rehearsal**. The 11th April rehearsal/show day will cost **£35**.

There are four options to pay for rehearsal fees:

- 1. Pay fees upfront (£321) or;
- 2. Spread cost equally over 6 months (£53.50 per month starting November)
- 3. Spread cost equally over 7 months (£45.85 per month starting October)
- 3. Pay for rehearsals monthly (cost will vary depending on the number of rehearsals (i.e. November has 4 rehearsals so this would equate to £32)

Rehearsal fees cover the costs of room hire, staff wages and support towards production costs (e.g. set, costumes, props)

AUDITIONS

Please Note: To audition for "Peter Pan Jr" you must be aged 7+ by the Friday 10th April 2026 unless discussed with and given permission by the Director.

Auditions for this production are open to all - you <u>do not</u> have to be enrolled at Performers to take part.

Auditions will be held on Friday 26th September at Park Community School in Havant.

It is important that you have read this pack clearly in addition to our Production and Rehearsal Policy which can be found on the audition registration page. This outlines our expectations for all.

To book an audition:

Audition registration will be available to book via our website from Friday 1st August 2025 at 9am.

Audition process:

All children are to arrive ready for a 6pm start. On arrival, children will be given a sticker with a number on. This will be the order in which they will go in to audition for the individual auditions from 7-9pm.

The first hour (6-7pm) will involve a 'dance workshop and audition'. Those auditioning will be given a short dance routine to learn in an intense dance workshop. Children will then be split into small groups where they will show the routine to the panel.

Following this, the individual auditions will commence from 7 to 9pm. Children will wait in the waiting area and when their number is called, will enter to complete their audition.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will someone read on for other character's lines?

Yes, one of the audition panel will do this.

Can props be brought in?

If the auditionee feels it will benefit their audition, absolutely!

Will there be music provided?

Yes, auditionees do not need to bring bluetooth speakers etc.

Can more than one character be auditioned for?

Auditionees can audition for <u>one character only</u>. Auditionees can write down any other characters they are interested in through the registration form as we may feel they are suited to a different role.

How long will the audition last for?

The dance workshop will last 1 hour. The individual audition will take no more than 10 minutes. How long it takes is also no indication as to whether the auditionee has been cast or not.

What do I do if I am auditioning for ensemble?

Those auditioning for ensemble will complete the dance workshop and are then free to leave.

What if I cannot attend the audition date?

Those unable to attend the audition date are to email their audition in (admin@performerstheatrecompany.com). The audition must include all audition material for chosen character in addition to the choreography found here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=94KIGxRKWY4

Please ensure that registration is completed in the same way. Absence must be stated in the comments section of the form.

We must receive this by Friday 19th September. After this, entries will not be considered.

Though Captain Hook is the villain of the show, he's also a bit of a clown who just can't seem to get what he wants. He has to be as treacherous to the Lost Boys as he is a complete wimp around the Crocodile. He is a larger than life villain! |

CAPTAIN HOOK: Aye, Smee, if I were a mother, I would pray that me children be born with this (indicating the hook) instead of that. (indicating his hand) But Pan flung me hand to a crocodile that happened to be passing by. SMEE: I have often noticed your strange dread of crocodiles. CAPTAIN HOOK: Not of crocodiles, but of that one crocodile.
